Friday 1st December was the first night of the much anticipated TRINS Broadway 2023. Throughout, this has been a student-led production. For those on stage, Friday was the culmination of all those practices, the lines learnt, time spent. For the backstage participants, from those who rephrased scripts and directed the plays, to those who made sure props were in place, the performances were also the presentation of what they had envisioned. The audience had a true treat for the senses: visually, the props, costumes, lighting and backdrops created a context; the music was stunning, with several show-stopper moments - and the dance routines brought music and visuals together in four original, innovative routines. 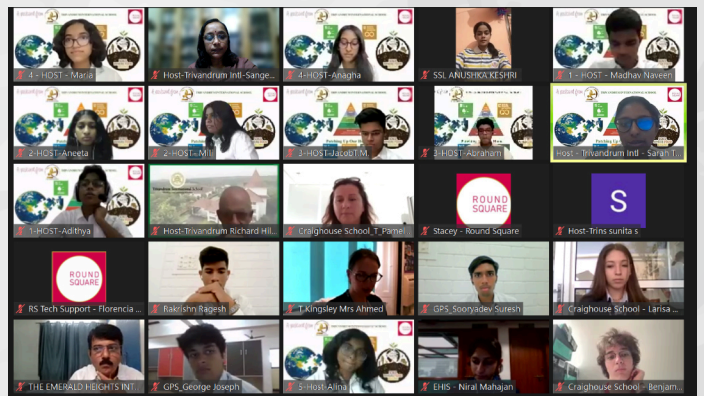

The theme was "Patching up our home". The Society is headed by Sarah Biji Tharakan, Student RS Representative, and Jacob T. M., Assistant Rep.
