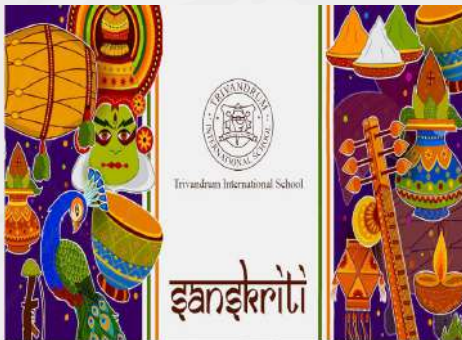

Booster Class

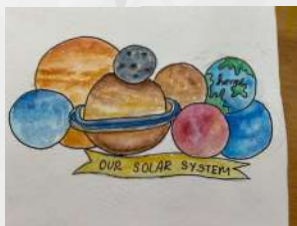
