


From The Principal's Desk:

The next edition of TRINS on Tuesday will carry pictures of both the Independence Day assembly and Founder's Day. In anticipation of the former, let me send you my greetings on the 77th anniversary of India's independence. It is a privilege for me to be able to spend time in this diverse and dynamic country making some contribution to the education of its young people.

Our Chief Guest for our Founder's Day celebration is the Honourable Governor of Kerala, Shri. Arif Mohammad Khan. All TRINS parents are invited to the event, a real highlight of the school calendar. Please reach the school in order to be seated by 3pm - if you are able to reach by 2.30pm, that will give you time to park and make your way to the auditorium. It is an honour for the school to welcome the Honourable Governor to this occasion and a fitting accolade as the school marks its twentieth anniversary.

This will also be our moment to celebrate the academic accomplishments of the 2023 graduating batch. This week we received the Cambridge International A-level results. I am delighted to report that the pass rate has increased, as has the percentage of students awarded the top grades. This is also the story for our International AS-level results, written by the Grade 11 students following the A-level route. What I am particularly pleased about is that these qualifications mean access to top universities now for our students and credit that they can continue to draw upon as they progress through higher education and into the world of work.



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Student Achievements

The release of the Cambridge International A-level and AS-level results for the June session on 10th August saw TRINS students awarded top grades for their academic accomplishments. International A-level examinations are written at the end of Grade 12 and enable students to gain entry to universities in India and across the world. The graduating students' destinations include Vellore Institute of Technology, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Manipal Institute of Technology, Georgia Tech (USA), Western University (Canada) and Bath University (UK).

39% of the grades awarded to TRINS students were the top A* and A grades. The school's toppers are Arati Nair, who achieved an outstanding four A* grades; Nitin Nanadakumar (three A*grades and one A grade); Riya Javas (three A* grades); Eeshaa Sethna (two A* and two A grades) - all also were awarded an A grade for AS-level English - and Mathew Mariel Joseph (four A grades).

The International AS-level examination is written by students at the end of Grade 11 and the result counts towards the final A-level grade. A is the highest grade that can be awarded to a candidate in this examination and 36% of grades awarded to TRINS students this year are A grades.

The school toppers are Meghha Rajith, Sidharth Siburaj, Nathania Ann Philip and Siddharth Gopalakrishnan, who scored four A grades each, and Alok Dhanus PV, who achieved three A grades and one B grade.

Congratulations to all our Cambridge A-level and AS-level students and to Ms Gayathri Rani and the teachers who have guided and encouraged them.


