### KG2 THEME 1 CULMINATION

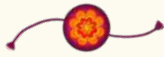

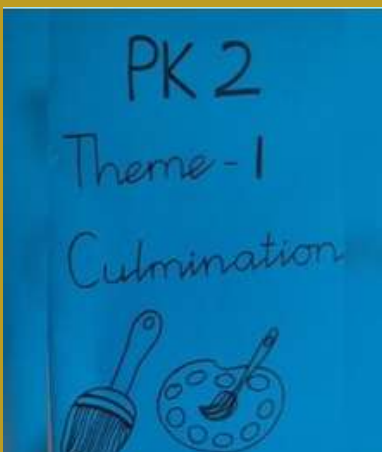
### THEME 1 CULMINATION - PK2 ART EXHIBITION
