#### FIELD TRIP

#### KG2 FIELD TRIP TO CHAKKA FIRE STATION

As part of their ongoing theme on Community Helpers, the KG2 children of City Campus along with their counterparts embarked on a theme-based field trip to the Chakka Fire Station on Wednesday, 23rd October. The visit was designed to provide the students with a hands-on learning experience about firefighters and their critical role in the community. The fire station team conducted an engaging session for the children, starting with the three essential safety steps to follow in case of a fire: Stop, Drop, and Roll. The children were introduced to various safety gadgets used during fire emergencies, such as the lifebuoy, jacket, helmet, ropes, oxygen mask, and fire extinguishers. The firefighters also gave the students a tour of the fire truck, explaining the different compartments and equipment inside. To top off the experience, the team demonstrated a mini fire drill using a robot, which captivated the children's attention. They were also informed about the emergency helpline number, 101, for fire-related emergencies.
