

THE ROLE OF CONCEPTS IN DRIVING INQUIRY IN THE IB PROGRAMME

In the International Baccalaureate (IB) programme, concepts play a pivotal role in driving inquiry-based learning. Concepts are broad, powerful ideas that have relevance within and across subject areas, helping students to make connections and develop a deeper understanding of their studies. By anchoring inquiry to these key concepts, the IB programme encourages students to explore significant and enduring ideas rather than just memorising facts.

Concepts such as change, causation, and perspective provide a framework for inquiry, guiding students to ask meaningful questions and pursue deeper investigations. For example, when exploring the concept of change, students might investigate how technological advancements have altered societies or how environmental changes impact ecosystems. By engaging with these concepts, students are encouraged to think critically and analytically, drawing connections between their inquiries and the world around them.

This concept-driven approach not only enhances academic learning but also cultivates important life skills. Students learn to synthesise information, identify patterns, and apply their understanding in various contexts. By focusing on big ideas, the IB programme helps students develop a holistic view of knowledge, preparing them to navigate and contribute to an increasingly complex and interconnected world.
