INTERACTIVE SESSION

Dr. Sini Regi Thomas

Dr. Sini Regi Thomas, Group Head Special Education Needs, has played a pivotal role in establishing the Special Education Department at TRINS into the award-winning beacon of inclusivity it has come to be for the Group today. Under her leadership, the department has expanded to include a team of 16 special educators, and the school has been recognised for its exemplary practices by the International Baccalaureate, the TES School award, and the Global School Leaders Consortium.

With over 15 years of experience in both inclusive and special school settings, her areas of focus include ASD, ADHD, learning disabilities, deafblindness, intellectual disabilities, and related challenges. She has steadily worked on her own and her team's extensive training and also facilitated several workshops for other organisations who reached out to us. Dr. Sini is the first Keralite to qualify for the Leadership Programme Fellowship at the Perkins School for the Blind in Boston. This was an advanced training programme professionals teaching visually impaired students with multiple disabilities and deafblindness. This 102-yr old fellowship awarded her a scholarship worth \$50,000. She holds Master's degrees in Sociology and Special Education, and Diplomas in Deafblindness (national rank holder) and Intellectual Disability (Kerala state topper). Dr. Sini completed her Ph.D. in Inclusive Education, with a thesis that serves as a resource for researchers developing educational apps. She has also completed a course on Assessment of Students with Extensive Needs and Augmentative and Alternative Communication for Individuals with Severe Disabilities, Early Childhood Development from Harvard University and American Sign Language.

Dr.Sini has been a panelist in a discussion on "Inclusive Education: Dilemmas and Challenges" conducted by Harvard University. She was the only special educator from Perkins School for the Blind to participate in the Grand Hackathon conducted by Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in Cambridge. She is a member of the India Inclusion Research Network (IIRN). She has been a force behind 'IEG', India's first free educational app dedicated to empowering and supporting teachers with best practices in inclusive education. She has presented papers at national and international conferences, published several research papers in esteemed journals and serves as a mentor and consultant for various organizations. She is registered with the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI). In recognition of her outstanding contributions to special education, Dr. Sini received the INSPIRE 3.0 Special Educationist of the Year award in 2023 from the Global School Leaders Consortium (GSLC).





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Ms. Rajitha Kaipulli, Assistant PYP Coordinator, Facilitator Numeracy has 14 years of experience in education, including 8 years at TRINS, Ms. Rajitha firmly believes that students excel and surpass expectations when teachers and parents recognize their potential and provide appropriate challenges. Her professional journey began as a Business Development Executive, but an unexpected transition to teaching marked a turning point in her career.

In her role, she is always looking to improve pedagogical approaches, enhance program delivery, and set high standards for teaching and learning. She focuses on designing and implementing an assessment system that empowers students to achieve their full potential by promoting self-regulated learning practices. Additionally, Ms. Rajitha coordinates PYP Round Square engagements, offering students valuable exposure to global perspectives and diverse cultures. She is dedicated to supporting students throughout their PYP journey, delivering engaging and relevant experiences that prepare them for future academic challenges.
