The Cambridge A and AS Level results were issued on 12th August. It gives me great pleasure to share that most of our students have done quite well in the A Level exam, with approximately 25% of our grades being in the high (A*- A) category and approximately 85% of our grades belonging in the upper mid (A*- C) category. Similarly, for the AS level, approximately

38% of the grades are in the high (a - b) category, and we would expect them to do even better in their A level exam. Please join me in congratulating the Cambridge Batch of 2025 for their wonderful results. Their success is a testament to their hard work as well as the dedicated efforts of the faculty who have supported them.

We have Broadway coming up shortly and as many of you are aware, the proceeds from the event are donated towards charitable causes. Cambridge Results:

We congratulate our 2025 Cambridge International A-level batch who received their results on 19th August. The 100% pass rate reflected the efforts of the students over the past two years, as well as their teachers. These globally-recognised qualifications provide entrance to universities in India and abroad. Institutions receiving TRINS students include: Manipal Institute of Technology, SRM Institute of Science and Technology, University College London, St Andrew's University (Scotland), Queen's University Belfast, Curtin University Australia.

Over 80% of the grades awarded are in the A*-C grade range. Our toppers are; Mili Savan (4 A grades); Rishi Neelanath (1A* 1A 3B); Antara Kunal Kothari (2 A 2B 1C); Adwaith Nair (2 A 2 B); Anna Mariyam Pavanathara (2A 2B); Joshua George Chandy (2A 2B).



The International **AS-level** results were also received on **19th August**, marking the halfway point in the two-year course for the incoming **Grade 12 students**. These marks will contribute half the final A-level total. With 18% of grades awarded at the highest A grade and over 60% of grades in the A-C range, these are a solid foundation for the students to build on. We congratulate them and wish them every success in the year ahead.

A big round of applause to all our students for performing exceptionally well and showcasing their talents with dedication and enthusiasm.
















Story Telling

EY Celebrates Independence Day with Pride and Joy




The activity not only deepened students' understanding of the topic but also highlighted their creativity, confidence, and communication skills.

Through engaging stories, puppetry and informal conversations, the children were gently guided to understand and appreciate individual differences.

The key message emphasized that not everyone shares the same interests or abilities, and therefore, it is important to be kind, supportive, and empathetic towards our peers. The sessions concluded with the children visiting and exploring the SEN department on the sixth floor.

On **14/07/2025**, the sensitisation session for **KG1**, **PK2 A**, and **PK2 B** was conducted very successfully. The **PK2** children were especially excited and amazed by the puppets, actively engaging with them through rhymes and storytelling. Meanwhile, the **KG1** students had the opportunity to visit and explore the **SEN department** on the 6th floor, showing great curiosity and enthusiasm throughout the visit.



We are proud to share a significant academic milestone from our SEN department.

Ms. Amritha Renganath, SEN Coordinator at ELC Technopark, has published her first research paper titled "The Effectiveness of Brain Gym in Improving Cognitive, Physical, and Social Skills in Children with Special Needs in an Inclusive School: A Qualitative Study."

The paper was published in Synergy: International Journal of Multidisciplinary Studies, Volume 2, Issue 2 (2025): Anniversary Issue – July 2025, following a rigorous double-blind peer review process. The paper is based on her work with five students with special needs at our school over a two-year period. Her findings highlight that Brain Gym may serve as a valuable complementary tool in inclusive education, with observed improvements in attention, literacy, motor coordination, and social interaction.
