### Principal's Message:

It was heartening to see parents, teachers, and students turn out in large numbers to purchase books from the book fair organized a couple of weeks back. On a personal note, reading is something that I immensely enjoy and have found pleasure in from my younger days. Reading can serve as a gateway to imagination and creativity and can open us up to ideas by broadening our perspectives. In a world driven by technology, reading can bring a much needed calm into our lives by helping us to focus and engage in reflection.

However, developing a reading habit does not happen overnight and needs to be consistently cultivated. Some strategies that can help to develop and sustain reading habits are –

- **Creating a routine** – Even 15-30 minutes of allotted reading time per day can be useful in getting students started on reading.
- **Agency** – While it is important to monitor the quality of what children are reading, it is also important to let them choose the type and genre of books that they are reading. When children are allowed some choice, it enhances the motivation to read.
- **Modelling** – This works really well with younger children as they often imitate what they see. One of my biggest influences with reading was my grandfather, who was a voracious reader. A home environment where reading is visible will encourage children to try the same.
- **Make reading a family activity** – Reading a book together, entering into discussions about what the child has read and understood, or a family trip to a book fair, library or bookstore can play a useful role in encouraging children to pick up reading as a habit.

The above is by no means an exhaustive list and there are various other methods that can be used to develop good reading habits. Ultimately, we would like students to view reading as a joyful experience and not as a task. That can only be achieved through coordinated efforts encouraging reading as a practice at school and at home.

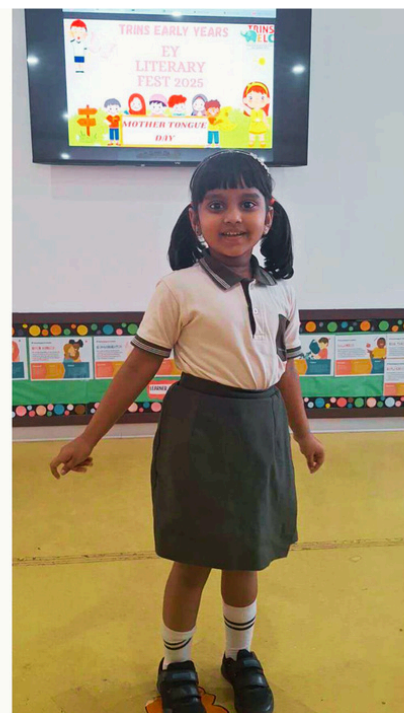

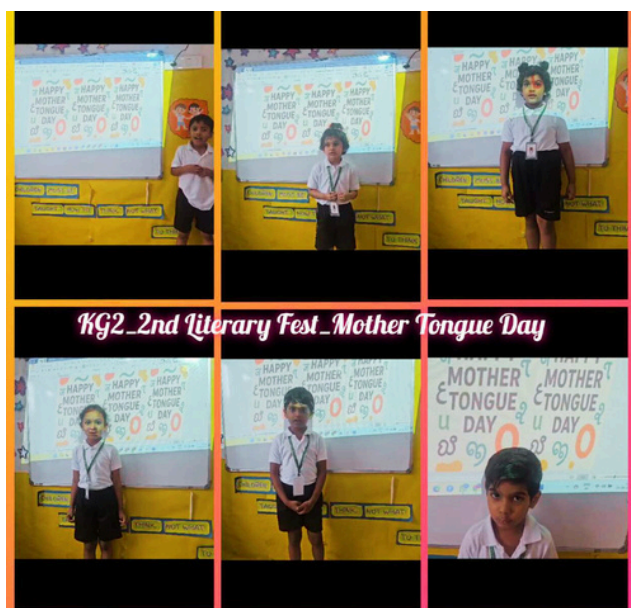
## Mother Tongue Day at ELC Technopark
