#### **Principal's Message:**

Last week, the PYP Student Council launched their initiative involving planting and caring for trees by sowing seeds. It makes me happy to see the young leaders in action, taking initiative to make a difference.

Such initiatives are not just about taking action, but have several learning outcomes embedded in them. For example, in this case, this was an initiative that was collaboratively brought up by the PYP Council. It was completely their idea in terms of actually seeking solutions to a global issue. Through this initiative – where in each class will be given one sampling to take care of nurture – they have also identified learning goals for other students wherein each student can actually become more responsible. They have thought of ways to maintain motivation among students by devising a reward mechanism, while keeping the spirit of the initiative intact. The students have taken ownership of every stage of the initiative so far – from idea generation to implementation – including working out the details such as the time required, identifying a space for the samplings, and identifying solutions to potential problems such as "who will take care of the plants when students are on vacation?" They have done their research – such as interviewing and consulting with the school gardener – to ensure that their actions are informed by facts and experience, and not speculation.

These initiatives therefore provide multiple opportunities for students through experiential learning. Knowledge gained through such action will last a lifetime and give students a valuable glimpse into real world problem solving and help in building critical thinking, social, and self-management skills. I look forward to more such initiatives – not just from the Student Council – but from students all over the school.


